## Singles Stroke-Play Competition (Men Only) Formats of Play & Terms of the Competitions Medal, Stableford, Bogey

## "It is the responsibility of each player to know and follow the Terms of the Competition"

- 1. **QUALIFYING COMPETITIONS** Handicap Indexes WILL be affected.
- 2. ELIGIBILITY:
- PLAYERS Players must be members of Thorney Lakes Golf Club.
- HANDICAP INDEX Players must have a Handicap Index.
- **NOTE** Members who have not completed the 54 holes required for their initial Handicap Index allocation are NOT eligible to win these competitions.
- QULIFACATION Players must have a minimum of 8 entries on their WHS playing record in the 12 months prior to the competition to be eligible to win. The entries can be a combination of Competition Qualification or General Play Scores.
- **NOTE** Non-eligible members may participate in these competitions at no cost for the purpose of either adding an entry onto their playing record to achieve their 8 entries, or as part of their 54 holes required for their initial Handicap Index allocation.
- 3. **HOW TO ENTER** Player can enter by either using the terminal in the Pro Shop or via the HDiD App to book their preferred tee times. This needs to be done no later than the 48 hours before the day of the competition. Late entrants will be accepted but their preferred tee time cannot be guaranteed.
- 4. **ENTRANCE FEES** Paid on the day in the Pro Shop. Players must collect the specially prepared scorecard before proceeding to the first tee.

## 5. **FORMATS OF PLAY:**

- **STROKE-PLAY** Each player competes against all the other players in the competition. The player who completes the round in the fewest total strokes (including strokes made and penalty strokes) is the winner. In a handicap competition, this means the fewest total net strokes.
- **STABLEFORD** A form of Stroke-Play. Points are awarded for each hole by comparing the number of strokes you have taken (including strokes made and penalty strokes) to the fixed target score for the hole which is Par.
- BOGEY A form of Stroke-Play that uses scoring as in match play. The player wins or loses a hole by
  completing the hole in fewer strokes or more strokes (including both strokes made and any penalty
  strokes) against a fixed target score, which is Par. The competition is won by the player with the highest
  total of holes won versus holes lost. (That is, adding up the holes won and subtracting the holes lost).
- **NOTE** Players' attention is drawn to Rule 3.3 of the Rules of Golf which provide more specific guidance when competing in Stroke-Play competitions.

- 6. **HANDICAP ALLOWANCES** 95% of the players' Course Handicap.
- 7. **COURSE TEES** Men will play from the White Tees. Any player whose Handicap Index was allocated using the Red Course, will play from the Red Tees.
- 8. **NOTE** Players using the Red Tees will receive an additional 0.3 strokes to their course handicap to reflect difference in course ratings between the White & Red courses before the playing handicap calculation is applied. (Equalization Shots)
- 9. **SCORECARD RESPONSBILITIES, PLAYERS & MARKERS** Before submitting a scorecard, players' attention is drawn to Rule 3.3b of the Rules of Golf which gives specific guidance on scorecard responsibilities in handicap stroke-play. Any breach of this rule is disqualification.
- 10. **ORDER OF PLAY** All competitions will start from the 1<sup>st</sup> tee. Any players found to be in breach of this term will be disqualified.

**NOTE** - All competitions covered in these terms & conditions are played over 18 holes.
